Law 63 Establishment of a Revoke

- Revoke becomes established
 - When the offender or his partner leads or plays to the following trick (any such play, legal or illegal established the revoke).
 - ♣ Play by the non-offenders to the current or following trick does not establish a revoke.
 - When the offender or his partner names or otherwise designates a card to be played to the following trick.
 - When a member of the offending side makes or agrees to a claim or concession of tricks orally or by facing his hand or in any other way.

Law 64 Procedure after Establishment of a Revoke

- Established revoke:
 - Tricks won prior to the revoke cannot be conceded.
 - Offending player won the revoking trick
 - ♣ Transfer the revoking trick and one more, if any additional subsequent tricks are won to the non-offending side;
 - Offending player did not win the revoking trick
 - This also includes the partner of the offender winning the trick on which the revoke occurs.
 - ♣ Transfer only the revoking trick if the offending side wins any subsequent trick(s) to the non-offending side.
- No rectification is made when:
 - Offending side did not win either the revoked trick or any subsequent.
 - A subsequent revoke is made in the same suit by the same offender, see later.
 - Revoke was made by failing to play any faced card on the table or belonging to a hand faced on the table, including a card from dummy's hand.
 - ♦ Attention is first drawn to the revoke after a member of the non-offending side has made a call on the subsequent deal.
 - Attention was first drawn to the revoke after the round has ended.
 - The revoke occurs on the twelfth trick.
 - When both sides have revoked on the same board.
- Director's responsibility for equity:
 - Deems non-offending side insufficiently compensated per above when:
 - ♣ After any established revoke, including those not subject to rectification:
 - Shall assign an adjusted score per Law 12 Director's Discretionary Powers.
 - Resolves in favor of the non-offenders if there is any doubt as to a likely result.
 - ♣ This comes into play when there is a question concerning whether additional tricks are won by the offending side because of the revoke. If there are when the non-offenders would have won additional tricks had there not been a revoke, the Director adjusts the score in favor of the non-offenders.
